NOMINATION PROCESS

According to our by-laws, nominations for the office of Director must be submitted to the Secretary of the Association in the 45 day period between July 15th and August 31st of the Year in question. **Nominations will not be accepted after that date.** A nomination for the position of Director must have the signature of the candidate certifying that he/she is a "member in good standing" and eligible for election. The member making the nomination must also sign the nomination form indicating that he/she is also a "member in good standing".

Nomination forms will be available at the LREA Ltd. office on July 1st of each year, and will also include a package of information regarding the duties and obligations of a Board member. This package of information will include the LREA Business Plan, Strategic Plan, and a copy of the latest independent audit.

LINEAR TAXATION

Lakeland REA is working with Alberta Municipal Affairs, Assessment Services Branch, to report its inventory for property assessment purposes.

Due to a government-driven change in linear taxation, Lakeland REA is required to provide a classification for each of its services.

Linear taxation will be charged based on classification which will help determine the category of the meter set at your property. By submitting the completed form below, you will help us in currently identifying which category your property falls under. If Lakeland REA has not previously classified your service, meaning we are unaware of your status, and you do not submit your completed form by September 1, 2018, you will be automatically defaulted to a farm classification. Please note, farms are exempt from linear taxation.

Starting in 2019, if applicable to your site you will see a line item on your bill that reads "Linear Taxation". Lakeland REA will update members on the cost associated with linear taxation once more information is available. Definition

Farming operations means the raising, production and sale of agricultural products and includes:

- (i) Horticultural, aviculture, apiculture and aquaculture;
- (ii) the raising, production or sales of horses, cattle, bison, sheep, swine, goats or other livestock, fur-bearing animals raised in captivity, domestic cervids or domestic camelids.
- (iii) the planting, growing and sale of sod; and
- (iv) an operation on a parcel of land for which a woodland management plan has been approved by the Woodlot Association of Alberta or a forester registered under Regulated Forestry Profession Act for the production of timber primarily marketed as whole logs, seed cones or Christmas trees.
